Cascade Columbia Fisheries Enhancement Group (CCFEG) is a grant funded non-profit working throughout North Central Washington to restore native fish habitat through enhancement, education and community engagement. CCFEG is currently seeking a Salmon Education Lead to boost the public's understanding and appreciation of our native fish, their ecology, habitat and factors that have led to their decline. This position will be responsible for implementing CCFEG's education and outreach efforts as well as assisting with the monitoring and implementation of planned and completed salmon habitat restoration projects. Position Details

Essential Functions of Position:

- Develop and lead environmental education lessons with k-12 classes throughout the region (fish dissections, raising salmon in the classroom, field experiences, etc.). Interacting with over 3,000 students per year.
- Plan and implement outreach events related to native fish species, watershed health, and other topics related to salmon recovery (movie screenings, speaker series, community plantings, etc.).
- Represent CCFEG and providing information about native fish species at community events.
- Develop Facebook posts, maintain CCFEG website, quarterly newsletters and email updates for CCFEG members.
- Assist CCFEG project managers with background research for grant development as well as fieldwork and monitoring for planned and completed restoration projects. This position will assist with the following projects: barrier inventory of the Wenatchee River basin, rock/recreational dam removal project in the upper watershed of the Wenatchee River, barrier removal projects, and large habitat restoration projects in the Wenatchee, Entiat and Methow Rivers.

Qualifications:

- The ideal candidate will have at least two years of experience teaching environmental education, a bachelor's degree in a related field, and a passion for improving our watersheds and the fish that inhabit them.
- Candidates must have a valid Washington driver's license, pass a criminal background check, and be flexible to work in the field and occasional weekends and evenings.
- Some duties will require work outdoors, in adverse conditions, for extended periods of time.
- The candidate should have the ability to transport equipment weighing up to 40 pounds over uneven terrain.

Compensation:

- Pay will be between \$20 - \$28 per hour (depending on experience), eligible for health, dental, retirement and paid time off benefits. This position is being offered at three quarter time (32 hours per week).
